## Every question means something

Did he actually pass out  $\rightarrow$  Syncope vs Pre-Syncope For how long  $\rightarrow$  arrythmogenic vs structural or metabolic Did he hit the ground  $\rightarrow$  Head or neck trauma? What were the preceding symptoms  $\rightarrow$  Palpitations or aura or dizziness? How does he feel now  $\rightarrow$  postictal or dizzy? Bit lip or incontinent  $\rightarrow$  Seizures Seizure activity  $PMHx \rightarrow Predisposing factors$ 







### Some Stats

- 1 in 50 pregnancies are ectopic!
- Classic triad occurs <50% of time
  - Abdominal Pain
  - Amenorrhea
  - Vaginal Bleeding
- Syncope is presenting symptom ~20% of time




## 38 y/o female passed out

#### Move to bystanders

- If no bystanders -> Look for meds or bracelet
  - Anti-epileptics
  - Insulin
  - New meds anti HTN





## The Vagal

Vasovagal Syncope → Emotional, Fatigue
Situational Syncope → Distended viscera (stomach, bladder)
Carotid Sinus Syncope → Tight neck


- 1. Abrupt withdrawal of sympathetic tone
- 2. Increase in parasympathetic tone
- 3. Rapid autocorrection







• Ablation, meds, AICD



## Things To Remember

- Passing out is a LOT of things and SUPER common
- Cardiac issues are the most worrisome
- Minimum ECG & D-stick
- But there are many other causes
  - Hypovolemia from missed trauma
  - Ectopics
  - Electrolytes
  - Dehydration
