ResQPOD devices for use during CPR were carried on ALS ambulances operated by FDNY EMS from 1/3/10 till 4/23/10. FDNY EMS said at the time "Based on the analysis of cardiac arrest resuscitation data, the Department has determined that the ResQPOD impedance threshold device (ITD) has not performed as expected".
