Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents (ICS-300)

Course Description:

This course is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently using the Incident Command System (ICS) in supervisory roles on expanding or Type 3 incidents. This course requires 24 hours for presentation. The course unit topics include ICS fundamentals review, incident/event assessment, unified command, incident resource management, planning process, demobilization, transfer of command, and closeout.

Target Audience:

Individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents or Type 3 incidents (NOTE: During a Type 3 incident, some or all of the Command and General Staff positions may be activated, as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions. These incidents may extend into multiple operational periods.)

Disciplines:

Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Emergency Management Agency, Fire Service, Hazardous Material, Public Works, Governmental Administrative, Public Safety Communications, Health Care, and Public Health.

Prerequisites:

To be eligible to attend the Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents course, candidates must have also successfully completed the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses offered by the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or the Center for Domestic Preparedness (CDP). Command or General Staff experience is recommended.

Course Objectives:

1. Describe how the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents.
2. Describe the incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System.
3. Implement the incident management process on a simulated Type 3 incident.
4. Develop an Incident Action Plan for a simulated incident.

This course is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System. This course focuses on management of expanding incidents.

Parking:

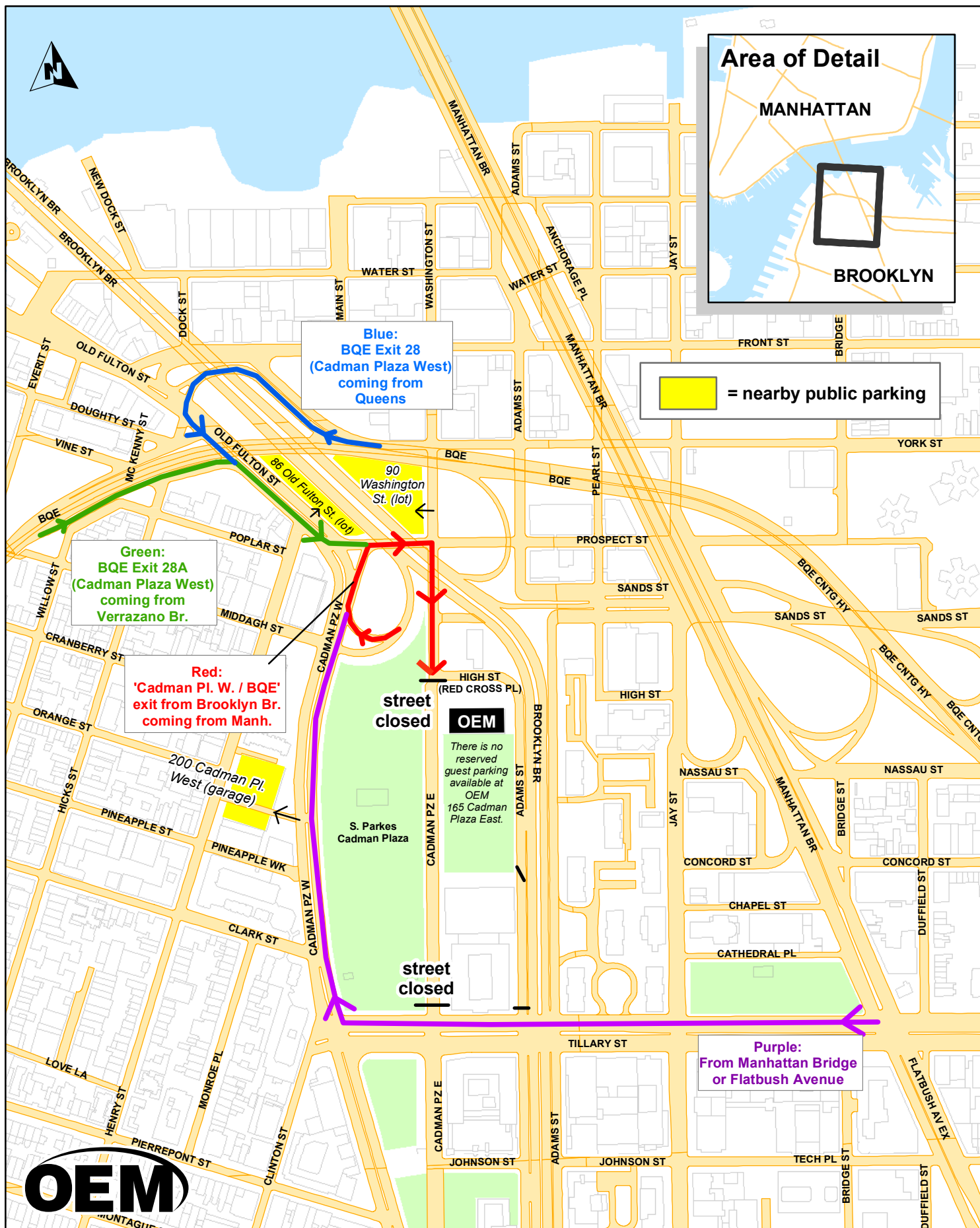
