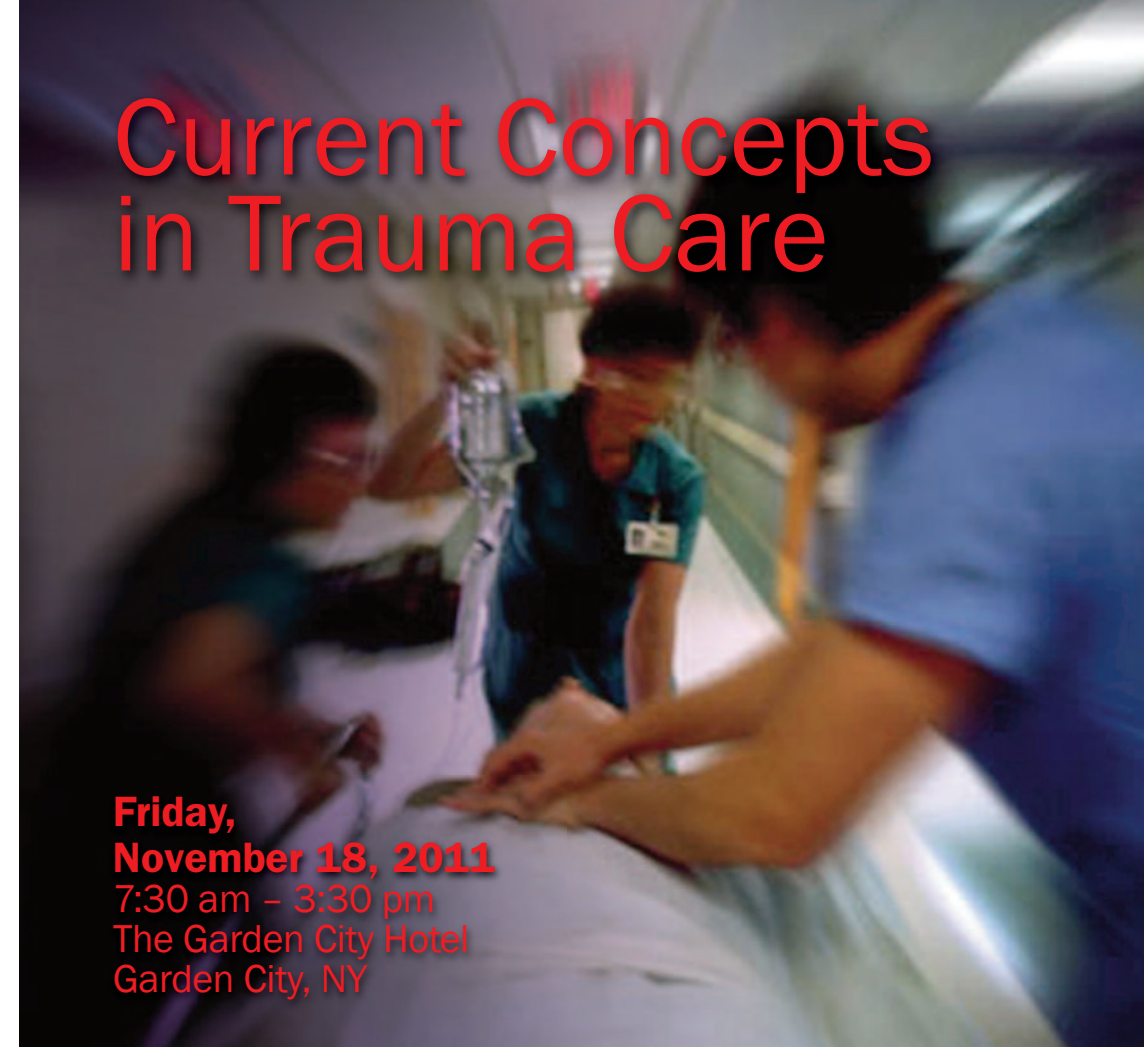

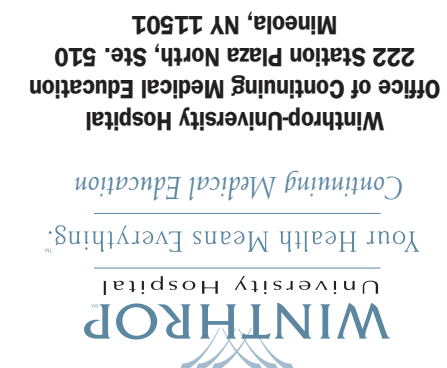

# Current Concepts in Trauma Care

Friday, November 18, 2011

## OVERVIEW

Timely and appropriate trauma care is essential to the health of the population. Why? Consider the statistics. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), unintentional injury kills more people between the ages of 1 and 44 than any disease or illness. Trauma (including accidental and deliberate injuries) causes 74% of all deaths from ages 10-24, 56% percent of all deaths from ages 25-34 and 31% of all deaths from ages 35-44. The elderly are at high risk, especially for pelvic fractures, as these are associated with low bone density, hysterectomy and a propensity to fall.

Early recognition in the ED and improving care in the ICU are two essential areas for continuing medical education for clinicians specializing in trauma care. Through didactic lectures and panel discussions, expert faculty will address some of the most prevalent trauma cases, including spinal, pelvic and geriatric trauma, as well as the use of interventional radiology in trauma care. The course will include a keynote presentation by guest speaker Raymond Shelton, PhD, who will discuss disaster management planning and preparedness.

- Evaluate, diagnose and manage trauma of the spine and pelvis
- Apply new knowledge and skills in the management of trauma in elderly patients
